To support an exhibition related to the Minidoka National Historic Site, a World War II Japanese internment camp in 1940s Idaho, an Imagine Your Parks project. This project will comprise an exhibition of artwork created at the camp or created by artists who have a personal connection with the Minidoka incarceration experience, such as Takuichi Fujii (1892-1964), Kenjiro Nomura (1896-1956), Teresa Tamura (b. 1960), Roger Shimomura (b. 1939), and Wendy Maruyama (b. 1952). Recognized as a unit of the National Park System in 2001, the internment site held more than 9,000 evacuees between the years 1942 and 1945. To engage visitors of all ages with the Minidoka National Historic Site, educational programming will take place at Boise Art Museum, at the national park site, and at Boise State University (BSU). The exhibition, scheduled to coincide with the annual Civil Liberties Symposium at BSU, will examine this difficult and tragic action of the U.S. government during World War II.
